SPECIAL THEME DIVISION DEFINITIONS Nature Special Theme – Birds

Defined as animals with feathers and wings. Wild birds, waterfowl and domesticated birds are allowed in this theme. However no mammals, fish or mounted subjects are allowed. The subject should be presented in its natural environment and should not be moved to a studio location.

Open Special Theme – Portraits

The Portrait Division is restricted to human subjects only. Portraits of animals, birds, etc., will not be allowed and will be disqualified.
