Histogram Basic Information

At tonight's meeting, Jeffrey Klug will tell you about using the *Histogram*, which uses a graph to show the brightness range in an image (running from dark to light— left to right). An average digital image has about 256 brightness levels... from absolute black (0) to absolute white

(255). The mid range is about 128 which is where. The histogram displays all the brightness levels of that image, so if the high peaks bump up to the left or right sides of the graph, the image is "clipped." If the histogram skews to the left, it is underexposed; if it skews to the right, it is overexposed A well-exposed image will have detail throughout the entire range of darks, midtones and bright areas.

Fortunately, Photshop and Lightroom offer options to help make more accurate tonal adjustments (along with other adjustment tools). The histogram (Levels) can help visually let you know what areas need some adjustment especially if the tones are all based in the middle of the image— you will need to create more contrast.

This is very basic information, but becoming more proficient at working with histogram levels is still a challenge. I used to work with the Curves adjustment, but learned a while back that the histogram gave me more contol and flexibility.




