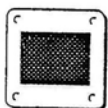

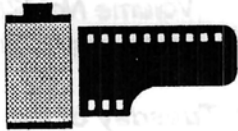

Forming a Philosophy of Art



Somewhere during the development of each photographer, a philosophy of what photography is, or should be, evolves. Sometimes this philosophy comes subconsciously along with the involvement in the media.

Other times, photographers consciously ask themselves questions about their work and its direction. While defining a universal philosophy of photography can be difficult, if not impossible, an individual can confront the questions as part of his/her own growth in photography. Here are some of them.

- ♦ What is the purpose of photography ?
- ♦ Should photography be concerned with aesthetics or is photography different from other visual media?
- ♦ What constitutes a good picture? How do you evaluate photographs?
- ♦ Is the straight print (unmanipulated) more valid in photography than the manipulated or contrived print?
- ♦ Excluding technical improvements, how have your photographs changed since you began photography?
- ♦ Are your photographs any different from anyone else's?
- ♦ What direction or where do you see yourself going in photographs?
- ♦ Does your photography say anything about you personally ?

Vince Condella of TV6 will be our featured speaker this month. As a meteorologist, he has plenty of experience with inclement weather. He will be giving us tips about photographing different weather conditions and the seasons. Think about questions that you may have about lens, cameras, film, and safety precautions that you might ask him. **Bring a Guest and introduce them to the club!**



Portraits....How are you doing? Consider the traditional portrait, straight on, head and shoulders view, plain background, well groomed. Then try photographing one person in as many different ways as you can conceive. Portraits can range from close-up to full figure. Close-ups can be parts of the face or body. The person's face does not have to appear in every picture. Try to taking pictures in more than one setting. Indoors or outside. The surrounding doesn't *have* to be attractive, in the garage or maybe at work. Try different types of lighting. Diffused, back lighting, a silhouette in a sunset, against a window, or from artificial lighting. Try different types of moods or expressions. Try different types of clothing from formal to casual, from natural to fantasy.

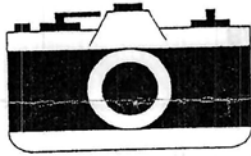


Nuts & Bolts Use long lens and a tripod for portraits. 105mm lens are great with 35mm cameras. Although verticals are most common, try horizontal also. Excellent films to try include Kodak Vericolor III and Fuji Reala and NHG.

Model Photography Rules

The models that will be photographed are amateurs. In most cases, they have never modeled before. *Your courtesy and patience* to them will be appreciated.

1. The photographer shall never touch the model under any circumstances. Verbal direction shall be used rather than physical handling.
2. The photographer shall use long enough lens to obtain the photograph desired without intruding upon the *private space* of the model. In other words, the photographer should never be closer than *six to seven feet* from the model. If the photographer wants a head or head and shoulders shot, a long lens should be used instead of a normal or wide-angle lens. Distorted pictures will otherwise result and the models *private space* will be violated.
3. The photographer shall not ask the model for her address or telephone number. If the photographer needs a model release for selling the photograph or publication, the photographer shall handle it through the camera club officers.
4. The photographer shall not dominate a model's time. This is unfair to the other photographers at the session and unfair to the model. After a few shots (3-6) or a couple of minutes time, the photographer should move to another model and give someone else a chance.
5. The use of vulgar language, actions, or suggestions will not be tolerated.

Lens For Correction

For recessive features, i.e. slight facial depth, use shorter than normal lens (as short as 35mm). For reducing elongated features, i.e. long noses or protruding chins, use longer than normal lens (up to 300 mm lens for portrait shots)

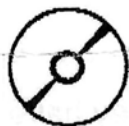

Prints from Prints (3x5 or smaller) 2 for 99¢ from Bear Photo on Appleton.

Ritz/Black Photography Store at Bayshore (also Crivellos at Brookfield) have a Kodak "Dream Machine" for enlargements in 5 minutes from 35 mm negatives. It's a do-it-yourself process. Feed in the negative. Select the picture (you view it on a computer screen). Select the size. Crop it. Adjust the contrast if necessary. Select "print" and 5 minutes later, you have a pretty good quality glossy print. Cost is high (~\$7.00 for 8 x 10) but so is the convenience.

Photo Tips

Collect photos that you like from books, magazines, and newspapers. Its a good idea to emulate the photographer. Try to figure how the picture was taken. Determine from what angle the camera was held. How was it composed? Cropped closely or full view? Try to use a similar technique for your next picture.

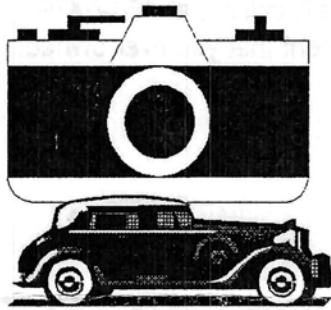


Placing film in the freezer or refrigerator will extend the shelf life an equivalent amount of time. If you keep your film frozen for 3 months, it extends the life 3 months. Just bring the film to room temperature gradually before you put it in your camera.

The new rechargeable alkaline batteries work as well as normal alkalines but can be recharged 25+ times. Recharge time is under three hours. They hold their charge better than nicads when not in use. Nicads have their advantages and disadvantages. They die faster but they will recharge your flash faster than alkalines. They can be recharged supposedly hundreds of times (but usually takes 12-16 hrs). Nicad AA's cost around \$1.00/ea.(if you shop around). Rechargeable alkalines cost \$2.00 - 2.50/ea. Chargers cost about the same but can not be used interchangeably.

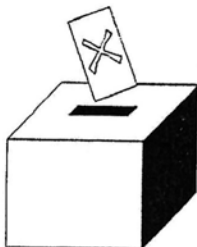

Nature Photography Seminar

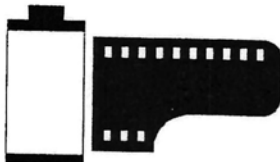


There will be a **Nikon Nature Photography Seminar** held at Riv-

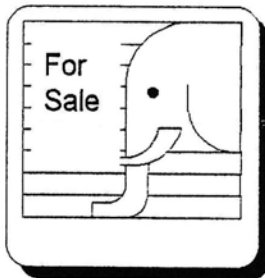

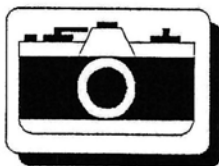
June Meeting The last meeting of the season will include elections, white elephant sale, and pin hole camera and photo-computer enhancement demonstrations.
