The board discussed and approved getting liability insurance for our club. Jeff is now working to see what sort of policy we can get. There will be more information at future meetings.


November Meeting

A quick note about **naming your images**. All images entered into competition must have a name or title. This title should be descriptive and unique. Competition organizers use this name for awards and to be sure that duplicate images do not win multiple awards. For example, "Kids at Play" is fine, but "DSCH 001" is not. And if you enter multiple images of a common subject, make sure that the names are unique. For example, if you have multiple images of an eagle, you may consider naming them "Eagle 11-1" and "Eagle 11-2".

So, I went looking for something else, something BIGGER. And there she was only a mile from my house floating on a pond, a duck. And, not just a duck but a mother

duck with 6 ducklings trailing behind her. I thought I had it made and vowed to go everyday and chronicle her life just like a National Geographic photographer would do.

The next day I found her being chased by a dog around and around the pond. Her babies scooted this way and that as they tried to be close to her and yet out of the way. Finally, I coaxed the dog out of the water and held onto the dog until the owners appeared. I was exhausted and the ducks huddled in a group hidden in the reeds at the edge of the pond.

Still not giving up I went again and this time the mother duck with her ducklings greeted me by swimming close by making quiet quacking noises. She was sporting a gaping wound to her neck and a few misplaced feathers. Through the camera lenses I could see that one of the ducklings had a large lump on its neck. Now my heart

was aching, what could I do? Would they make it?

In one short week every one of those ducklings was gone. But, the mother duck recovered and managed to raise another set of ducklings that same season, with several surviving to fly away for the winter.

I spent 2 summers sitting on the edge of the pond watching and photographing that duck and her ducklings. She would come from across the pond when I pulled up and parade her tribe around for me offering many opportunities for practicing the art of picture taking.

Getting a Second Opinion

Do you have an image that you really love but when you show it to your friends, you don't get much of a response? Do you have an image that follows all the "rules" is of a unique subject but still leaves you feeling flat?

Well at this month's meeting you have a chance to find out why. John Kimpel, a profession photographer, is our program speaker and he will be doing critiques of your images.

The anonymous serious second opinion of your image can offer a lot of insight into how your image comes across to an impartial viewer. It is one thing to show your photo's to your fellow

camera club friends and hear "hey that's a nice one" or "great color" or "nice composition" but when you really want to know what worked or what didn't work and why, you need a serious critique.

A serious critique can offer you that in-depth analysis of your image with a thoughtful appraisal of all the elements in the image and how they work together. Even seemingly perfect images may benefit from that second opinion, that second pair of eyes seeing that small detail that you may have overlooked. Maybe you just crave having a completely independent person (read not friend, family or co-worker) give you their honest opinion of your image.

Are you getting cold feet, wondering what you should bring if anything? Are you worried that you will be singled out with the only lousy image of the night?

Bring anything you like from your favorites to something that missed the mark. And, remember this is an anonymous critique; you won't be singled out!

So, what is your excuse for not bringing any images?

It's easy just bring a jump drive with 2 jpeg images and John Kimpel will do the rest.

Taking the image is only the start. You have to "finish" the image. That means putting on the spit and polish. Maybe you end up with fewer images but they will be more meaningful to you and to those you share them with.



Model Shoot Guidelines

Here are some of the basic guidelines for shooting models. Please follow these at our June Model Shoot

- Communication with your model is critical to getting the image you want. You may never touch your model or adjust his/her clothing or hair. You must ask the model to make any changes you want.
- Constant instruction is critical to let your model know if he/she should hold the pose or make changes. Keep a close eye on the model's clothes and hair and have him/her adjust as necessary. Remember to be kind when making comments. A happy model will result in better pictures.
- 3. Do not invade the model's personal space. Use lenses that will allow you to shoot from at least 6 feet away.
- 4. Do not dominate the model's time. There are other club members waiting for their turn.
- When selecting images to give to the model, make sure you choose the most flattering poses.

For this photo shoot, there will not be any model releases given to individuals. The model releases will be retained by the club. This shoot is meant to be a learning experience for our members and is not to be used for profit.

Please remember that if you participate in the model shoot, you will be expected to turn 5-10 images of each model on a CD that are full resolution image-ready (jpeg, tiff, or PSD). Each model should be in an individual folder. Please mail these CD's to Jeff Klug, PO Box 376, Hubertus, WI 53033-0376 by June 22nd.
